What is Human Trafficking?

US law defines Human Trafficking as the use of force, fraud, or coercion to compel a person into commercial sex acts or labor or services against his or her will.

The one **EXCEPTION** involves minors and commercial sex. Inducing a minor into commercial sex is considered human trafficking regardless of the presence of force, fraud, or coercion.

Action	Means*	Purpose
Induce Recruits Harbors Transports Provides or Obtains	Force Fraud or Coercion	Commercial Sex (Sex Trafficking) or Labor/Services (Labor Trafficking)

*Minors induced into commercial sex are human trafficking victims—regardless if force, fraud, or coercion is present.

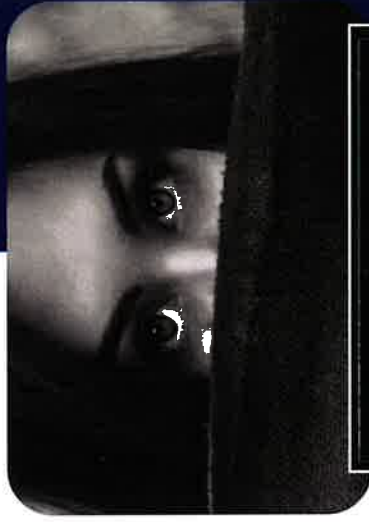

MODERN DAY SLAVERY A LOOK AT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Sex Trafficking

Sex trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery in which individuals perform commercial sex through the use of force, fraud, or coercion.

Minors under the age of 18 engaging in commercial sex are considered to be victims of human trafficking, regardless of the use of force, fraud, or coercion.

The Signs

- Branding often on the neck or chest
- A girl inappropriately dressed for her age or the weather
- A minor with someone during school hours or late at night
- A young person being controlled by someone older than them
- Unaware of what city they are in or the purpose of their stay
- Not in control of their money or identity documents

**These are only some of the signs that may indicate a sex trafficking incident

Labor Trafficking

Labor trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery in which individuals perform labor or services through the use of force, fraud, or coercion.

Labor trafficking includes situations of debt bondage, forced labor, and involuntary child labor.

The Signs

- Feel pressured to stay in a job or situation they want to leave
- Owe money to an employer or recruiter or are not being paid what they were promised or owed
- Do not have control of their identity documents
- Threatened by their boss with deportation or other harm
- Working in dangerous conditions without proper safety gear, breaks, or other protections
- Are living in dangerous, overcrowded, or inhumane conditions provided by an employer

**These are only some of the signs that may indicate a labor trafficking incident
